Welcome to the Niceville Public Library

We hope that your visit to our library is enjoyable and that your informational needs are met. Cards may be obtained by presenting identification verifying current name and address (driver's license, Florida ID card, auto registration, printed check, recent utility bill, property tax bill, rent receipt, or lease agreement). A parent or guardian must sign if the applicant is under 17. This adult is responsible for any items checked out by a minor. Parents are responsible for monitoring their children's use of library resources. For young people under the age of 16, a parent or legal guardian must sign an Internet Use Permission form at the Circulation Desk.

You may also register to vote at this time.

Non-County Resident Fees:

For a fee of \$35 per family, anyone living outside of Okaloosa County may obtain card/cards for one year. These cards may be used at any of the Cooperative libraries within Okaloosa County.

Guard your library card:

You are responsible for all materials checked out on your card. The replacement fee for a lost card is \$3.00 for adults and \$2.00 for children.
